According to the rubric employed, a grade of B means that they created and supported a clear thesis, using logical organization, ample supporting evidence, reasonably hard thinking, plus good arguments, evidence, examples, and details. Their thesis contained only minor flaws in organization and coherence, and only minor grammar, punctuation, spelling, or formatting mistakes. It showed evidence of good research and sources, used the scholarly work of others to support its thesis, and documented its sources correctly.
