From education and career programs to health and life skills, our staff and volunteers help inspire youth by providing an opportunity to belong, succeed and serve their community.

We seek a Youth Development Training Coordinator who is highly organized and well-versed in technology and data-driven solutions. Additionally, the individual should possess strong interpersonal skills and the ability to engage effectively with both internal and external staff. Candidates with experience in youth development and programming are encouraged to apply.

Goals and Duties of The Position

The VISTA, serving as the Youth Development Training Coordinator, will develop a comprehensive youth development training program, which will include in-depth professional development trainings, and career development trainings for staff.

The specific duties of the position include:

- Research and conduct an initial assessment of engagement and retention practices in similar organizations within the Capital Region.
- Complete a market analysis of the BGCCA's current employment opportunities.
- Conduct research and analyze program data to inform decision-making and programmatic improvements.
- Develop and maintain relationships with internal and external staff.
- Coordinate logistics and provide support for program events and activities, including training sessions, and community engagement events.
- Assist in the recruitment, training, and supervision of program volunteers and interns.

 Participate in program meetings and contribute to program planning and development efforts.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must have an Associates level education or higher
- Have a growth mindset
- US citizen or have permanent resident status

Living Allowance:

VISTAs earn a living allowance for their service. The annual living allowance is \$22,882, which is \$877.66 on a bi-weekly basis.

- 10 paid personal and 10 paid sick days

- CDTA bus pass
