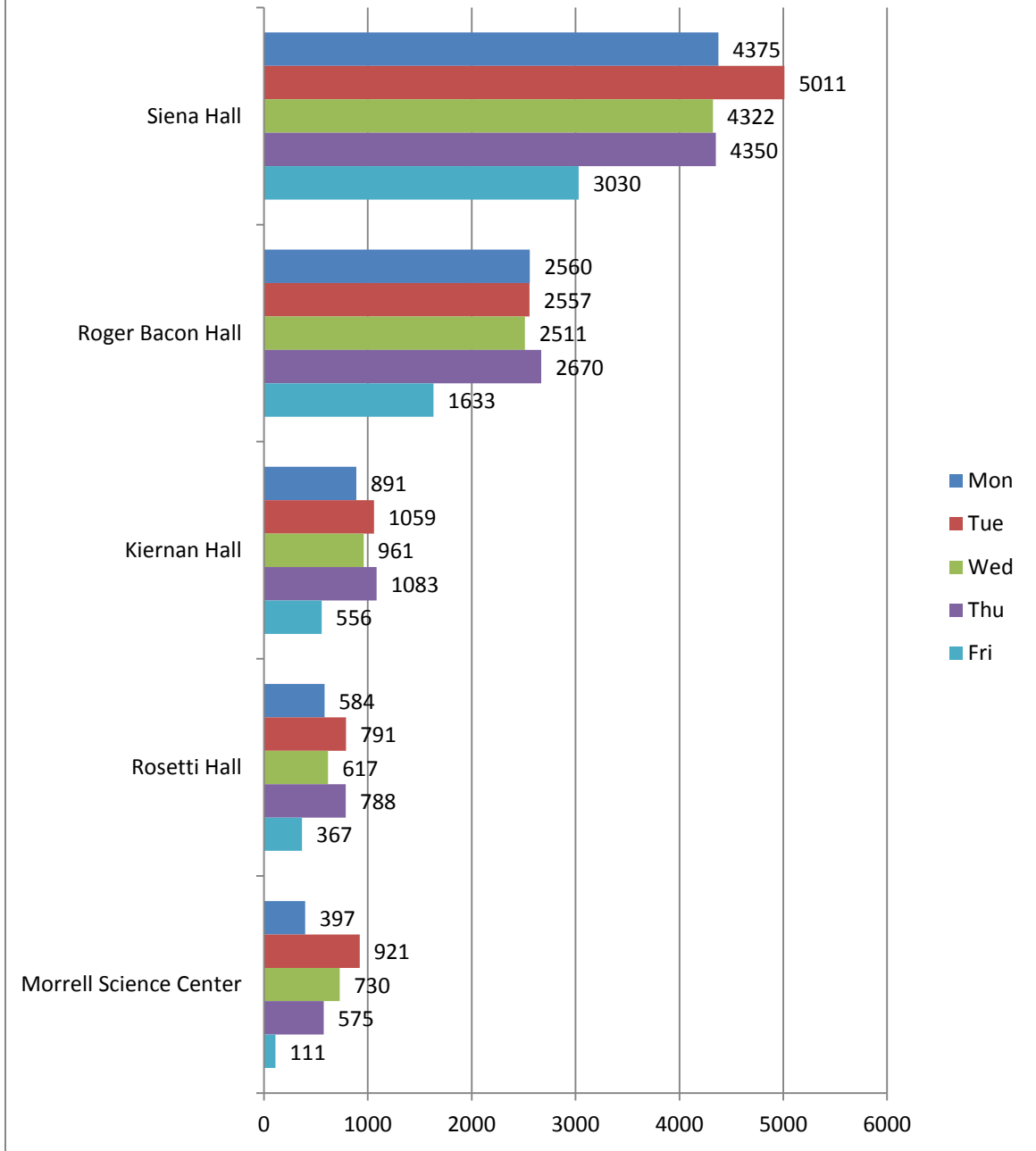

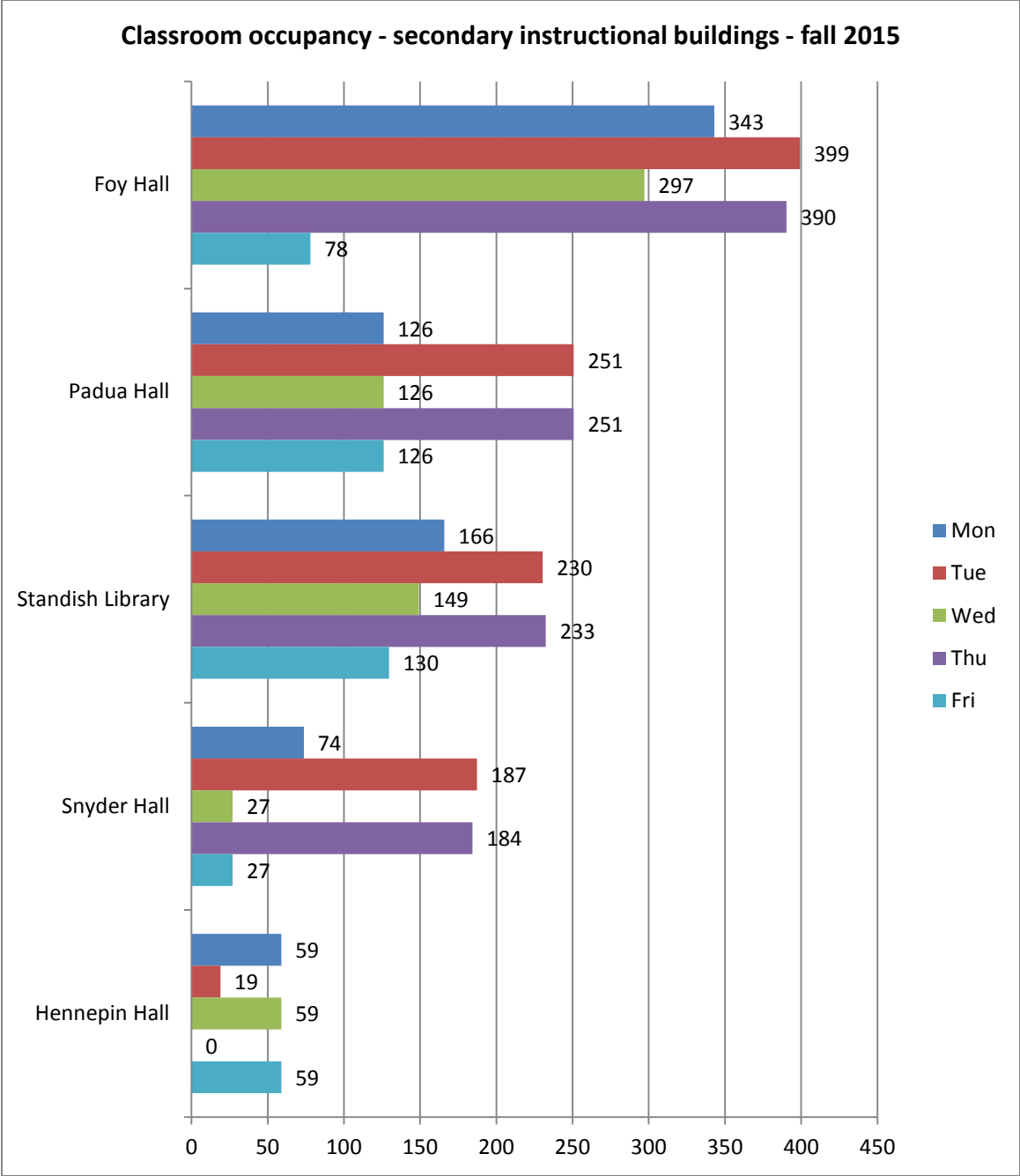
Siena Fast Facts

Last week our *Fast Facts* looked at class attendance by time slot. We'll continue that theme this week, but focus our attention on building and classroom usage. The chart below shows the number of seat-hours by building for fall 2015. (A seat-hour is defined as the number of students in a class multiplied by the number of hours the class meets. For example, a class with 20 students that meets for one hour counts for 20 seat-hours, while a class with 20 students that meets for two hours counts for 40 seat-hours.)

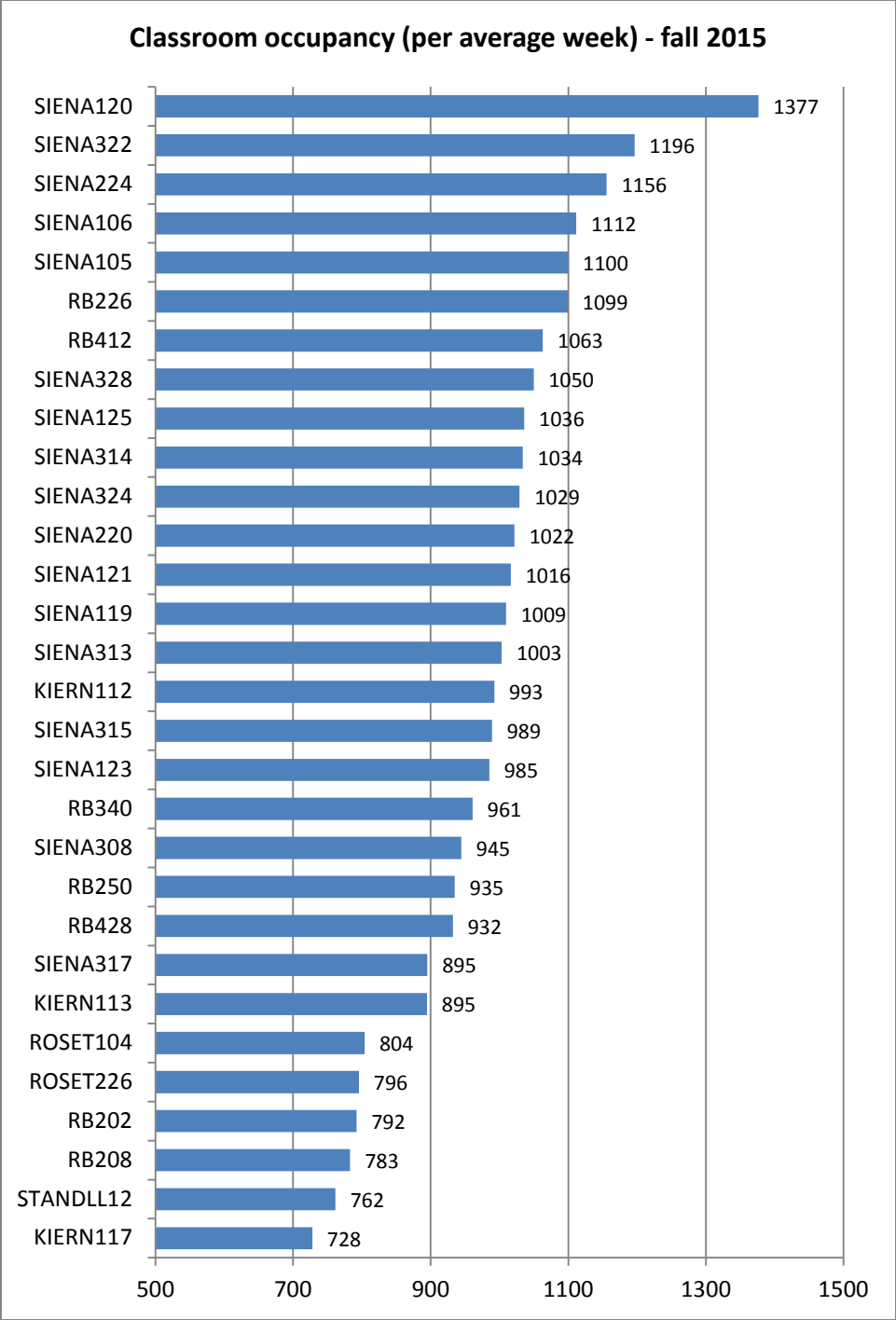
Classroom occupancy - primary instructional buildings - fall 2015



Not surprisingly, Siena Hall is the most heavily used building, followed by Roger Bacon Hall. Kiernan Hall, Rosetti Hall, and the Morrell Science Center round out the top 5. The remaining instructional buildings are shown in the chart below.



The chart below shows the number of seat-hours by individual classroom, for the 30 busiest rooms.
