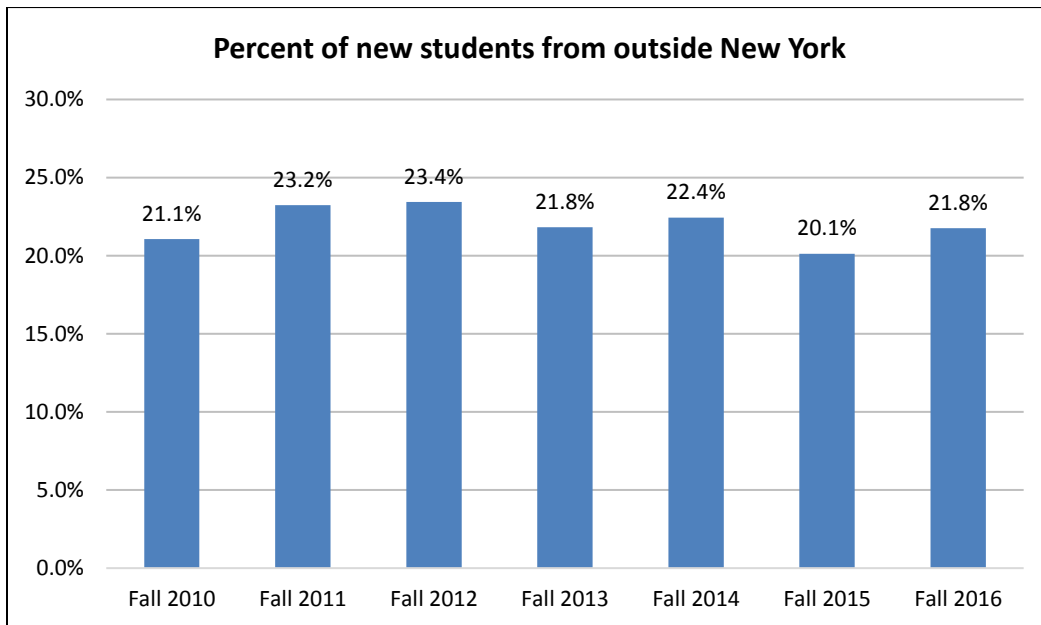


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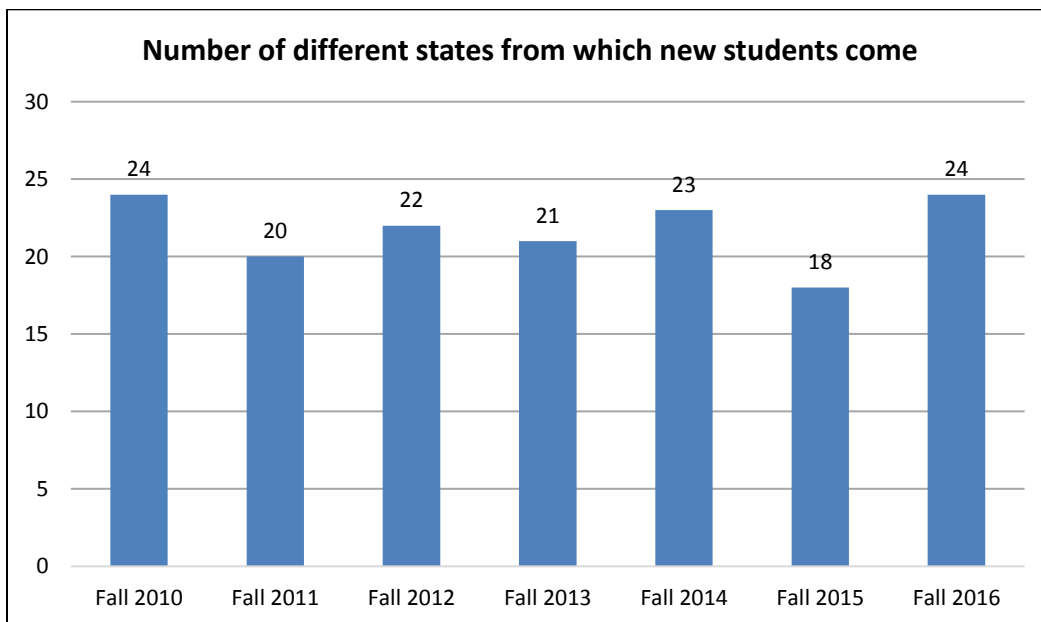
Siena Fast Facts

Last week we turned our *Fast Facts* attention to the incoming class of 2020. We will continue that topic this week, with a focus on where our new students are coming from.

The fall 2016 cohort of new students is slightly more diverse, geographically speaking, than the fall 2015 cohort. The chart below shows the percent of new students from outside of New York for the last seven cohorts.



The chart below shows the number of different states and U.S. territories from which new students have come.
