*Siena Fast Facts*

Every fall we have lots of great students who are admitted to Siena and choose to join our campus community. But of course there are also a lot of admitted students who choose to go elsewhere. This week our *Fast Facts* will look at some of the other institutions where our admitted students have gone instead of Siena.

The cohort for this analysis consists of new students who were admitted to Siena for the fall 2016 term but chose to attend another institution. The table below shows the top institutions selected by these students, and the number of students who went to each institution. (These data are extracted from the National Student Clearinghouse.)

Here are a few random observations from this data:

- Not surprisingly, SUNY Albany tops the list, as it has in previous years.
- Four out of the top five cross-admit institutions are SUNY schools.
- Three of the top ten cross-admit institutions are in Connecticut.
- There are no schools on this list from three neighboring states: Massachusetts, New Jersey, and Vermont.
- 14 out of 31 schools on this list are public institutions, while 17 are private.
- Only one community college shows up on this list, namely HVCC. Clearly, admitted students who don't attend Siena are primarily choosing other 4-year institutions.
