Siena Fast Facts

This week our *Fast Facts* will continue to look at some of the other institutions where our admitted students have gone instead of Siena. The cohort for this analysis consists of new students who were admitted to Siena for the fall 2016 term but chose to attend another institution. (These data are extracted from the National Student Clearinghouse.)

The table below shows the top institutions selected by these students, and some key characteristics of Siena applicants who chose to attend those institutions. The “Count” column shows the number of Siena applicants who went to each school. The “HS GPA” column shows the average high school GPA of those students (where 100 corresponds to a 4.0 GPA). The “% diverse” column shows the percent of those students were of a diverse ethnic background, while the “% female” column shows the percent of those students who were female. The last line shows the data for applicants who did choose to attend Siena.

So, for example, if we look at the line for SUNY Binghamton, we can note the following:

- The students who applied to Siena but went to Binghamton instead have a higher average high school GPA (94.2, compared to 90.4 for the Siena enrollees).
- The students who applied to Siena but went to Binghamton were more diverse than the Siena enrollees (35.2% diversity compared to 24.2% for Siena).

On this list, the institutions with the highest average high school GPA (at least for students who had been admitted to Siena) were:

- SUNY Binghamton
- SUNY Stony Brook
- Fordham University
- SUNY Geneseo

The institutions with the highest percentage of diverse enrollees (again, for students who had been admitted to Siena) were:

- SUNY Stony Brook
- SUNY Buffalo
- St. John's University
- SUNY New Paltz
- SUNY Albany
- University of Connecticut

Once again we see quite a few of our public competitors on these lists.
