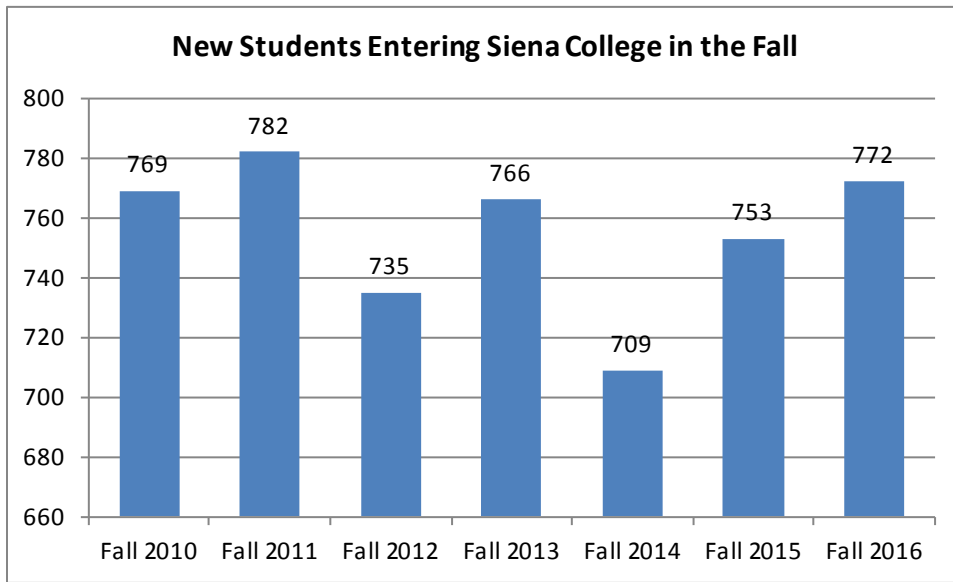

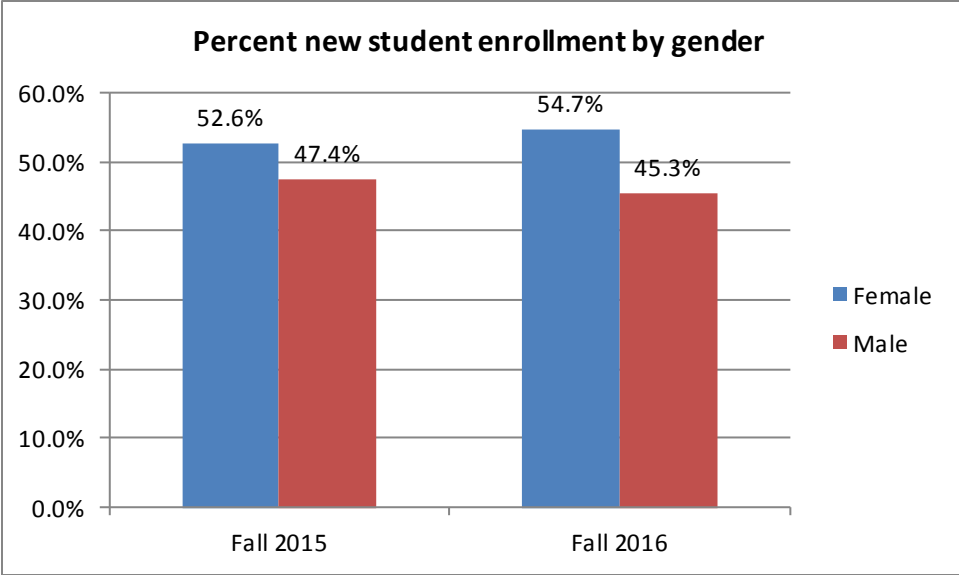
*Siena Fast Facts*

As summer winds down, we will turn our *Fast Facts* focus for the next few weeks to the incoming class of new students. Welcome to the Class of 2020!

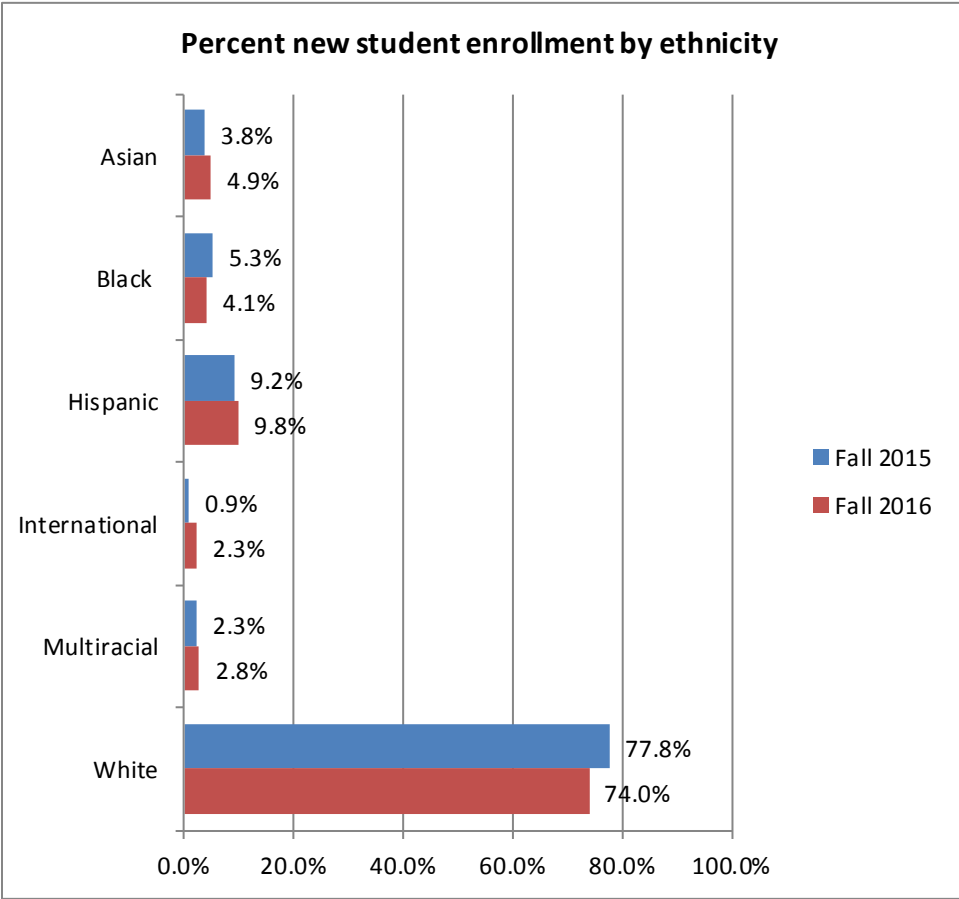
As of right now, there are 772 new students registered for fall 2016, compared to 770 new students who were registered this time last year. (We wound up with 753 on census day last fall.) The chart below shows the number of new students for the last few years (all data is from the census date, except of course the fall 2015 data).



The chart below shows the breakdown by gender for the fall 2016 cohort compared to the fall 2015 cohort. There is a slight increase in the number (and percent) of female students in the fall 2016 cohort. (We saw a similar trend last year, though more marked. The women are taking over! Which might be a good thing...)



The chart below shows the breakdown by ethnicity for the fall 2016 cohort compared to the fall 2015 cohort. The 2016 group is slightly more diverse, with a bit of an increase in the percentage of Asian, Hispanic, and international students (although there is a bit of a decline in the percentage of black students).
