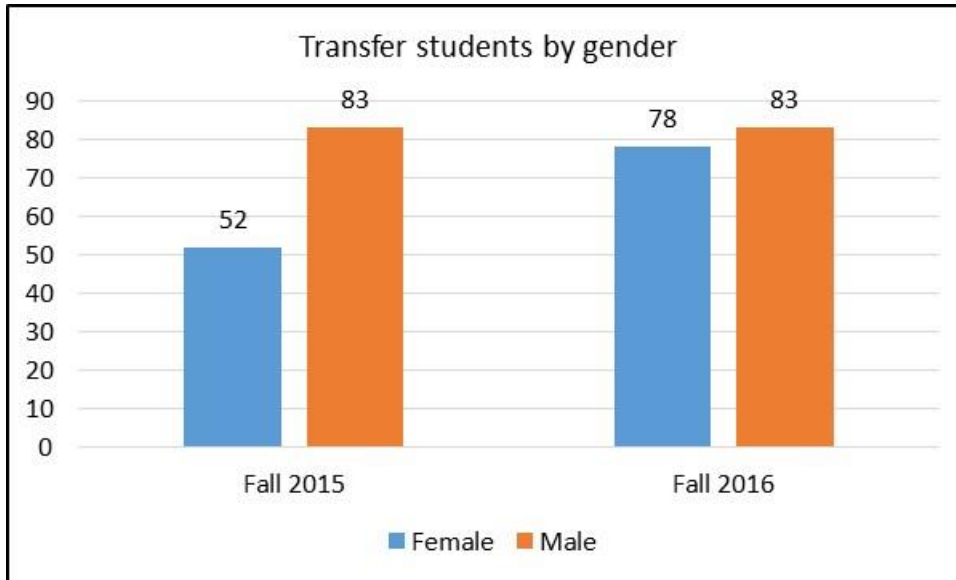

*Siena Fast Facts*

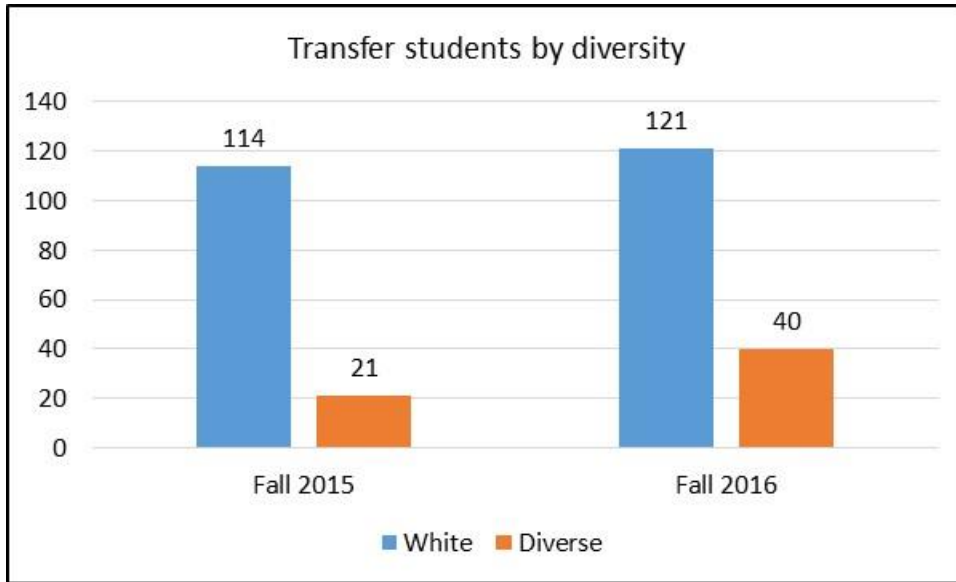
This week's *Fast Facts* will continue our focus on incoming transfer students, with a look at their demographic profile.

The chart below shows the number of students by gender in our transfer cohorts for fall 2015 and fall 2016. (Note that fall 2016 data are still preliminary.)



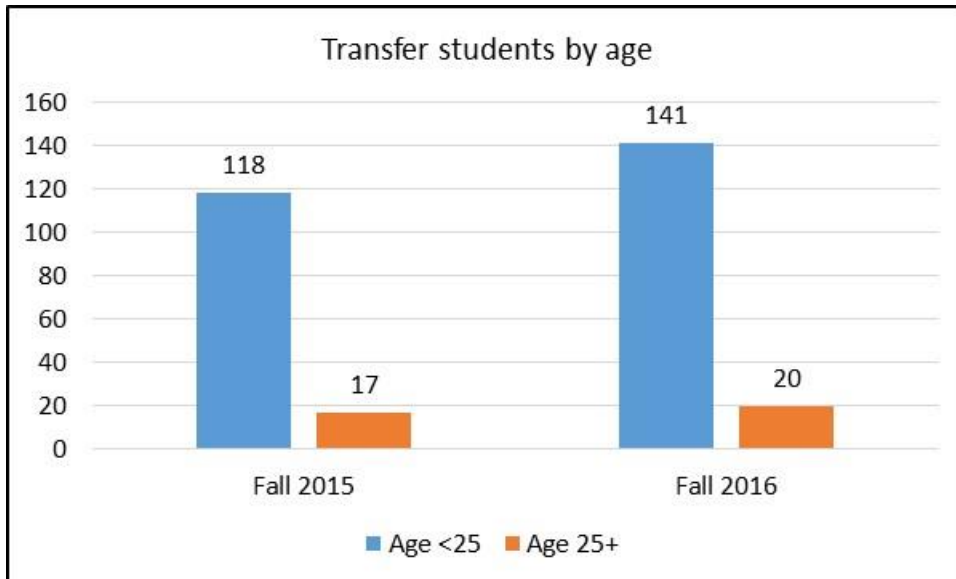
The two cohorts have exactly the same number of male transfer students, but the fall 2016 cohort shows a 50% increase in the number of female transfer students.

The chart below shows the number of diverse students in our transfer cohorts for fall 2015 and fall 2016.



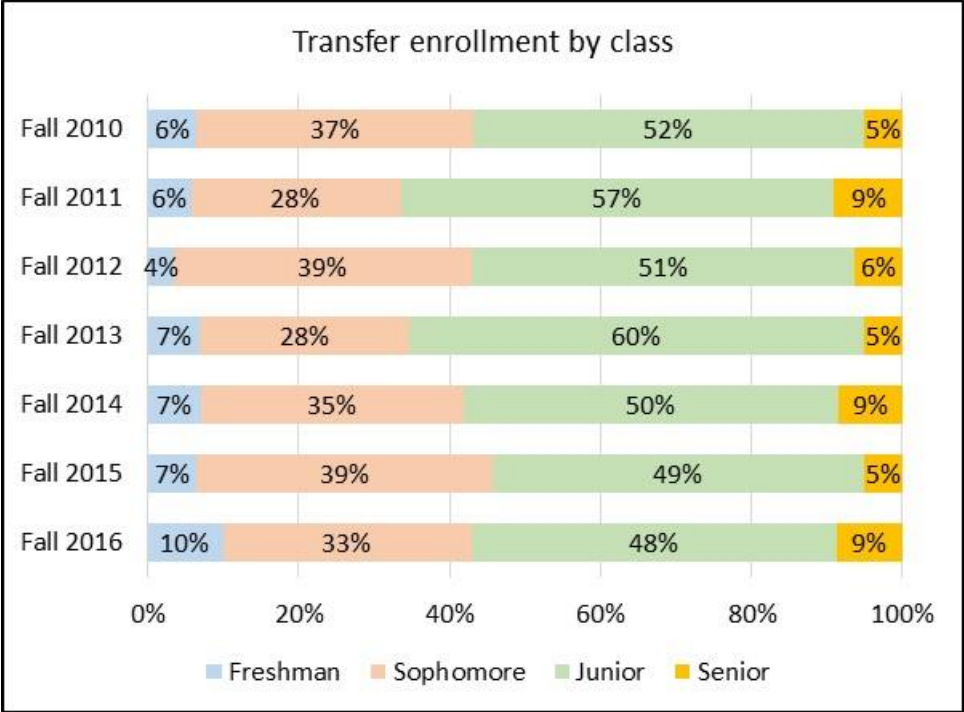
For fall 2016, the number of diverse transfer students has almost doubled compared to fall 2015.

The chart below shows the number of transfer students who are age 25 or older (i.e. “non-traditional” students) in the fall 2015 and fall 2016 cohorts.



Not much difference here. For both cohorts, about 12% of transfer students are non-traditional age.

Finally, the following chart shows the percentage of incoming transfer students by class, based on the number of credit hours transferred.



These data indicate that typically about 85-90% of transfer students matriculate as sophomores or juniors. Very few matriculate as freshmen or seniors, although the incoming 2016 class has a relatively high percentage of freshman transfers.
