## **MAJOR COURSES ABROAD**

Students in the Biology B.A.-Albany Medical Program cannot take science coursework abroad for major credit. Any science courses taken abroad will count as general electives. Students should therefore prioritize taking major biology, chemistry, math, and physics at Siena.

Students can complete humanities courses abroad (such as philosophy or religion) as well as Core requirements including, but not limited to: CDA (Creative Arts), CDS (Social Sciences), and Franciscan Core (CFD, CFH, CFJ).
