MAJOR COURSES ABROAD

The following courses in the Biology B.S. major can be completed abroad:

BIOL electives

Students should prioritize taking auxiliary courses (i.e. chemistry, math, physics) at Siena. Most of these courses cannot be done abroad.

Students can also complete Core requirements abroad including, but not limited to: CDA (Creative Arts), CDS (Social Sciences), and Franciscan Core (CFD, CFH, CFJ).



STUDY ABROAD LOCATIONS

The following study abroad locations offer excellent courses for Biology B.S. students, some of which can count as upper-level biology electives:

GAIAS (Galápagos Islands, Ecuador)

University College Cork (Cork, Ireland)

Coursework includes:

- Evolution & Diversity
- Biochemistry of the Central Nervous System
- Cancer Biology

Stellenbosch University (Stellenbosch, South Africa)

Coursework includes:

- Understanding HIV in South Africa: A Health & Social Justice Perspective
- Applications in Biometry
- Natural Forest Ecosystems

School for Field Studies (Bocas del Toro, Panama)

Coursework includes:

- Tropical Coastal Ecology
- Principles of Resource Management
- Environmental Policy & Socioeconomic Values
