MAJOR COURSES ABROAD

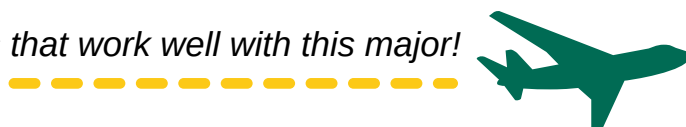
The following courses in the English major can be completed abroad:

The following study abroad locations offer excellent courses for English students:

University of Glasgow (Glasgow, Scotland)

Coursework includes:

Augsburg University (Cuernavaca, Mexico)

Coursework includes:

Korea University (Seoul, South Korea)

Coursework includes:
