Study abroad enables history students to engage, criticize and analyze regional and national histories, visit world-renowned museums and historical sites, pursue internships or self-directed research, and so much more!

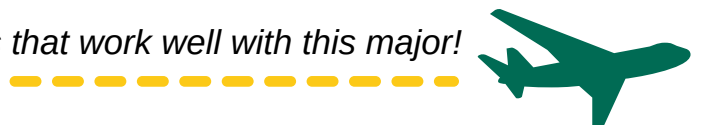
MAJOR COURSES ABROAD

The following courses in the History major can be completed abroad:

- European History (HEUR) electives
- Non-Western History (HNW) electives
- American History (HAM) electives
- HIST electives
- Foreign Language credits

Students can also complete Core requirements abroad including, *but not limited to*: CDA (Creative Arts), CDS (Social Sciences), and Franciscan Core (CFD, CFH, CFJ, CFN).
