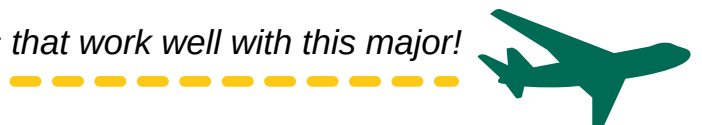
MAJOR COURSES ABROAD

The following courses in the Philosophy major can be completed abroad:

- PHIL 210 (Ethics)
- PHIL 290 (Greek and Roman Philosophy)
- History of Philosophy elective
- PHIL electives

Students can also complete Core requirements abroad including, *but not limited to*: CDA (Creative Arts), CDS (Social Sciences), and Franciscan Core (CFD, CFH, CFJ, CFN).

STUDY ABROAD LOCATIONS

The following study abroad locations offer excellent courses for Philosophy students:

University of Ghana (Legon, Ghana)
