Study abroad enables Spanish students to increase fluency in the language, immerse themselves in Spanish culture and local traditions, pursue internships in business, medical studies or education, and so much more!

MAJOR COURSES ABROAD

The following courses in the Spanish major can be completed abroad:

• SPAN Electives (including SPLT and SPUL attributes)

Spanish language courses may be taken abroad for the major, if they are at the appropriate level (such as 201/202 or 301/302).

Students can also complete Core requirements abroad including, *but not limited to*: CDA (Creative Arts), CDS (Social Sciences), and Franciscan Core (CFD, CFH, CFJ, CFN).

Coursework includes:

- Comparative Perspectives on Human Rights in Latin America
- Contemporary Film and Media in Latin America
- Understanding Argentina Through its Art
- Internship, or Directed Research
