IMPORTANT NOTES ON COURSEWORK ABROAD

- Students complete a course approval form prior to going abroad, identifying classes they wish to take. **Course approvals** are managed through the Registrar's Office.
- Once students arrive abroad and register for classes, the Registrar's Office will make a note on
 the student's degree report indicating what they are fulfilling for their degree. Specific course
 requirements, however, will remain as "not complete" on the degree report until their
 transcript is received after the end of the study abroad program.
- Study abroad grades transfer in with an asterisk (such as B*), denoting that study abroad grades do **not** affect students' GPA.
