QUICK TIP:



DON'T LOVE YOUR FIRST SENTENCE?

DELETE THE FIRST THREE SENTENCES AND TRY AGAIN.

WHAT ADMISSIONS LOOKS FOR ...



A well-written, thoughtful personal statement that tells them something about you they can't learn from the rest of your application

A proofed essay—no typos, no grammatical mistakes, no spelling errors

A logical argument or creative response, if you're answering a specific question



AS YOU WRITE IT ...

DO

- ✓ Start with a first sentence that really draws the reader in.
- ✓ Continue writing even when you feel blocked, then go back and edit. There may be something usable there.
- ✓ Keep asking yourself if you're answering the question at hand. If you aren't sure, start over.
- ✓ Stay true to your writing style. There's no need to use long words when a short one will do, if that's how you normally talk.

DON'T

- ✗ Embellish or be dishonest about the stories you're telling.
- ✗ Forget to break it up into paragraphs. Even though it's personal, it should still have an introduction, body and conclusion.
- ✗ Use a passive voice when you can make it more active.
- ✗ Stress about the final draft. You'll get there!
- ✗ Use humor too much or in the wrong way. It's a fine line, since you won't know who will be reading your essay.

Wherever you're applying to college, the application essay is a great opportunity to show Admissions how well you write. Make it a slam dunk using these tips.

5 THINGS TO DO AFTER YOU WRITE IT

- 1 READ IT OUT LOUD**
so you can distinctly hear clunky parts that don't make sense.
- 2 ASK THREE PEOPLE TO READ IT**
with specific goals in mind: a teacher to look at the content and grammar; a parent to find missing words and typos; and a friend to make sure your voice shines through.
- 3 CHECK THE WORD COUNT**
If it's over the requirement, go back and cut. If the application only has a suggested minimum, keep it concise and close to that.
- 4 USE SPELLCHECK**
and other reputable sources for words you aren't completely sure about.
- 5 HEED ANY SUGGESTIONS YOU TRULY FIND USEFUL**, but at the end of the day, stick with what you're comfortable with and believe in.
